Instructor Related Questions: Kaan Onarlioglu (20 comments)

Q: What were the strengths of this course and/or this instructor?

- 1 This is the best instructor and best course I have taken at any learning institution. I have never had such an active Professor that cared about students' learning this much. Every day he came to class ready to teach and would stay overtime at the end of class to help students complete the out-of-class challenge assignments: he stays with students for several minutes and helps students go through their code; something that is incredibly valuable but rare among other professors. The instructor is incredibly knowledgeable on the subject and very willing to help students, especially when students struggle. The out-of-class challenge assignments are the most updated and cover the most bleeding-edge security concepts; they are incredibly interesting and create a great sense of accomplishment when done. Expectations throughout the course were always very clear. This is a rigorous course and it is absolutely worth it for students that actually want to understand cybersecurity. Kaan is the best.
- 2 Kaan made my first foray into a cybersecurity course (besides Foundations) a truly positive experience. His slide decks were extremely verbose for our benefit, and was able to bring in real-world experience and relatability to each subject we covered. The challenges were intellectually-stimulating, and really made you think outside of the box. And while the classes were very long, his charisma and humor made going to class each night a great experience. The learning outside of the classroom for the challenges can be largely self-led, but again Kaan is there to answer any questions you may have. Overall, a highly recommended course with an even more highly recommended professor!

A lot of the learning happens when going through challenges, and they were extremely satisfying to complete. It can be frustrating struggling through the challenges at times, but the high when you figure it out it worth it

Kaan was also great in the classroom. He was great at explaining the topics at a high level, and left the details for us to figure out for ourselves. He was also extremely helpful on Piazza which is a rarity among professors I've found. He responded quickly and with answers

that gave use a good direction on what to try / look at next.

Q: What could the instructor do to make this course better?

- 1 N/A
- 2 Kaan made the transition from teaching grad courses to undergrad courses very well. Potentially having more in-class examples (on top of the ones we already had) would be good opportunities for further learning, but it's understandable to keep things how they are if the learning is largely meant to be student discovery.
- 3 N/A
- 4 I love every aspect of this class except for the quizzes and exams. I do think it's worth having some form of tests, as there is a lot of important information we might otherwise forget since they're not exercised in the challenges. But something about the format/frequency of the tests and quizzes doesn't sit well with me. Getting an 80 on every exam causes a lot of anxiety, and while it's been communicated that we're not expected to get some answers, I think it would be helpful to get a better idea of how grading will play out when we get back our exam scores.
- 5 I really enjoyed Challenge 3, it would be interesting to cover some more material here about Linux security if possible. Challenge 5 and 9 were also fantastic (especially the side-channel one, which was very cool).
 - I think it would be helpful to have an example of a Python alternative in the slides/or a demo (or some other scripting language) as an approach to solving buffer overflows in Challenges 6 and 7. I found this method a bit more approachable and faster. It might help other students in the future as well.
- 6 Content wise I think the course is set up well. I knew Bash pretty well before I came into the class which helped tremendously navigating around the challenges, I'd imagine for someone who doesn't these challenges would be a lot harder. Maybe some help there would be good.
 - I think regarding challenges its the right amount of work. I think that I would have been a lot more stressed if I didn't self impose 1-week deadlines for myself on the challenges. If I had multiple challenges to work on in 1 week I easily imagine that I'd get pretty stressed and get behind easily. 1 week strict deadlines on the server though seems a bit too harsh. I liked the flexibility of the 3 week deadlines. I think another huge factor was not having new challenges during some weeks that helped settle down on challenges.

Q: Please expand on the instructor's strengths and/or areas for improvement in facilitating inclusive learning.

- 1 No recommendations, already very inclusive learning.
- 2 Starting each lecture with seeing how the different kinds of attacks we learned how to perform and mitigate were still major headlines was a great chance to see that what we were covering still had an impact today. Kaan was very personable, and would go out of his way to help you when you were stuck. Can't recommend this guy enough.
- 3 He was always available to answer questions and provide feedback/support. Additionally had question slides interspersed throughout the presentation to ensure that everyone had an opportunity to ask questions.
- 4 Make sure to keep the break in the middle of the lecture--around 10 minutes is useful. Or, maybe even two 5-minute breaks would be great. 3 hours is a long time!
 - Also, keep making sure to encourage and emphasize the importance of asking questions on Piazza. That's the way I was able to learn best in class especially since we only met once a week! Thanks for a great semester Kaan--I really enjoyed the course! :)
