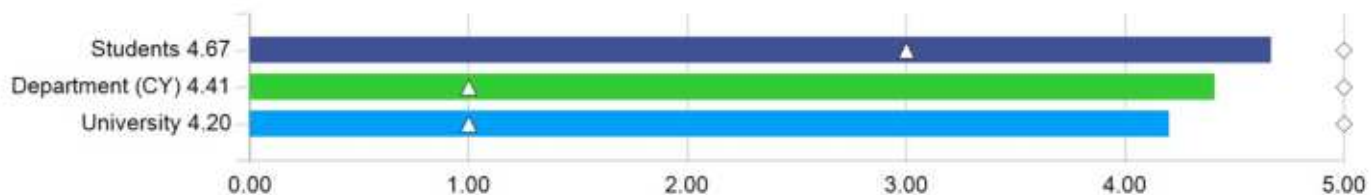

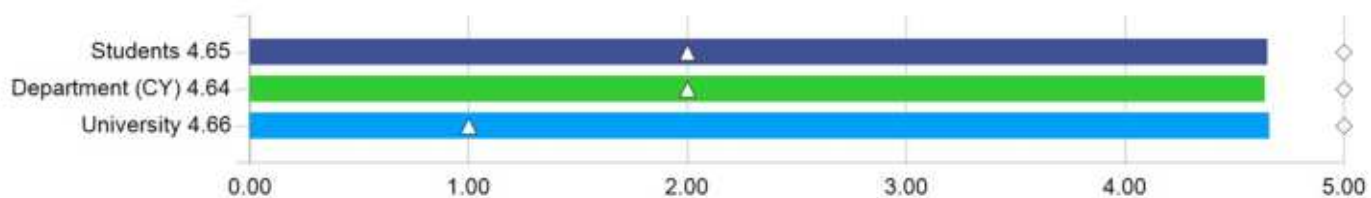

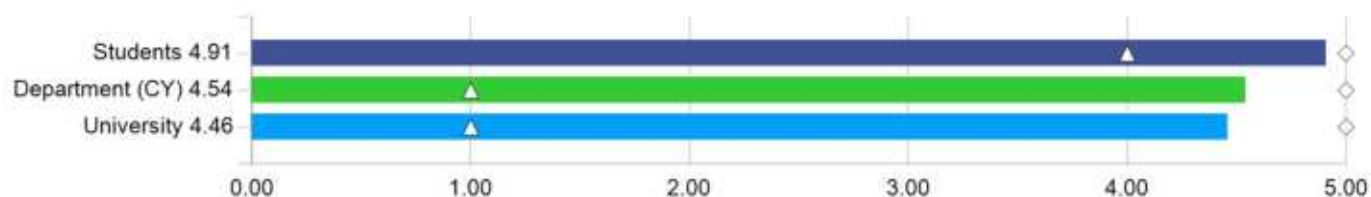
Comment

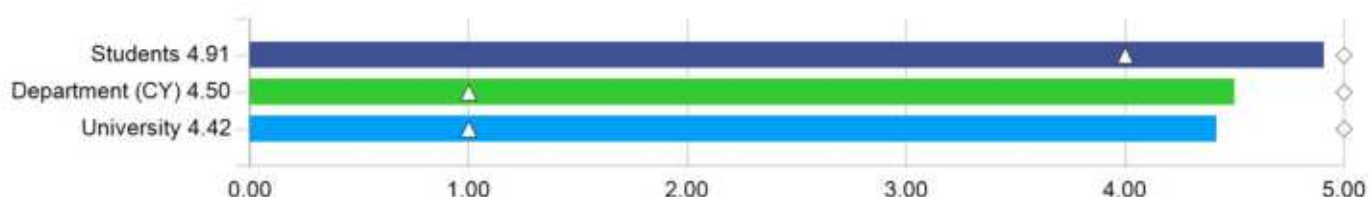

What were the strengths of this course and/or this instructor?

Comment
The strengths of this course was the interactive CTFs made which made the assignment a lot more fun and challenging at the same time.
Kaan is extremely knowledgeable about the subject matter and has given me more practical insights into this field than any other professor I have had at Northeastern. A lot of students get intimidated by him but as long as he can tell you are genuinely putting in effort (and especially if you go to office hours), he will have your back and want you to succeed in his course. He did an especially good job of making the course requirements clear from the beginning and encouraging students to be realistic about whether they wanted to drop the course and retake it another semester without sounding like he was trying to fearmonger. With that being said he doesn't go easy on anyone but keeps the class very engaging and provides real-time feedback on in-class answers. He actually made the 6–9:20 lecture slot bearable!
The course assignments and challenges themselves can feel overwhelming, but as long as you start early you'll learn a ton and have a fun time doing it. I looked forward to the challenges each week and I feel that I am leaving the course as a better programmer with a renewed interest in cybersecurity. The hands-on style was excellent for my learning style and I would be eager to take any other class Kaan taught. I really believe he is an incredible asset to Khoury and the cybersecurity program wouldn't be the same without him.
I enjoyed the layout of the course. A few of my peers thought it would have made more sense to cover security architecture closer to the beginning of the course (before memory exploitation), but I disagree. It was more interesting to see the implications of design decisions before discussing them.

Comment

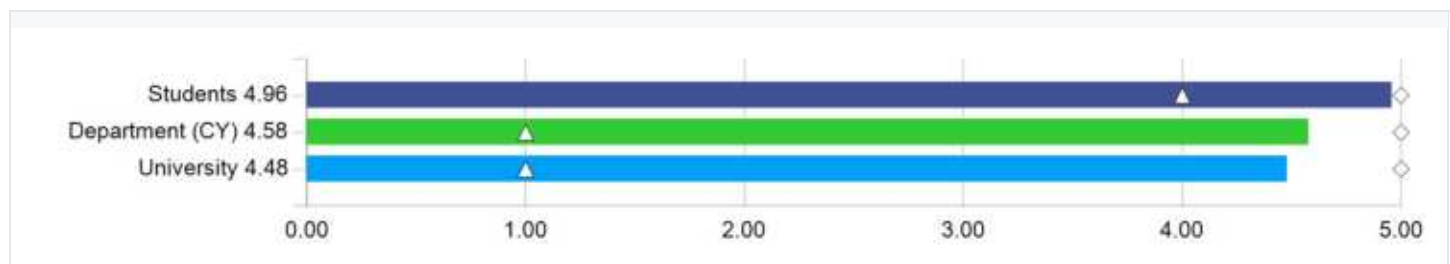
Please expand on the instructor's strengths and/or areas for improvement in facilitating inclusive learning.

I think a participation grade might have made sense because I would have liked to hear input from more of my classmates during lectures, but I also understand that this might not necessarily lead to meaningful discussion. Either way he was willing to call on everyone and I don't think he ever played favorites with his students. The course was very inclusive to people without a cybersecurity background but did require some basic knowledge of programming. He did a good job of introducing everyone to assembly language in case anyone hadn't had a class that covers that topic without spending too long on it.
The course is structured quite well and allows for very steady learning that is based on how willing you are to experiment with the topic at hand.
Kaan is really good at explaining the concepts and at designing challenges that force the student to practically apply their knowledge.

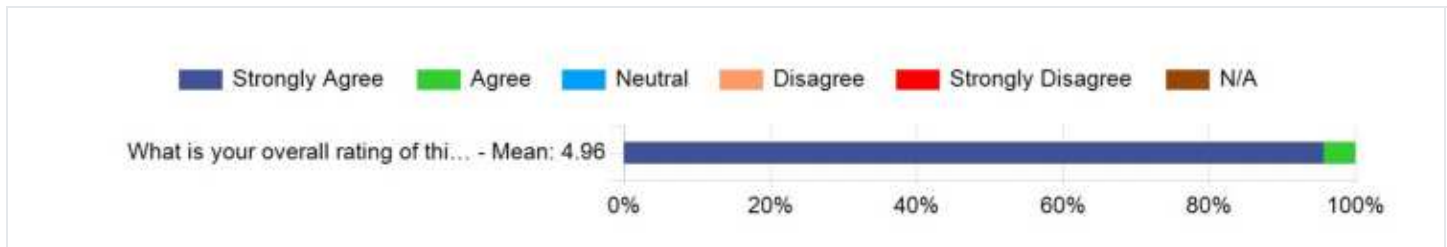
